

## **STATE AND FEDERAL ASSISTANCE**

**Outstanding Grants received prior to 2001** **\$ 960,000**

**1999 TEA-21 Grant** **\$ 560,000**

Construction included a pedestrian bridge and sidewalk in Marilla Park, sidewalks along Patteson Drive, and Burroughs Street.

**2000 TEA-21 Grant** **\$ 250,000**

Grant included the construction of safety fences, and gravel berms along the Caperton and Deckers Creek trail to create a safer environment for walking and biking. Safety fencing and berms are complete. Grant is in process to be closed out with WVDOT. Grant is still open due to reconstruction of some spots in the trail that the contractor needed to repair before the City pays the final invoices.

**Metropolitan Theatre Preservation Foundation** **\$ 90,000**

Grant will be used to renovate the interior of the 1924 facility. Renovations may include the Sprinkler System, upgrade the plumbing, and/or other interior renovations important to pass code inspections.

**Ruby Memorial Hospital - Rosenbaum Family House** **\$ 50,000**

The Rosenbaum Family House was awarded funds through the Local Economic Development Assistance (LEDA) Program. The City of Morgantown is the conduit for this non-profit agency to receive LEDA Grant funds. Grant funds will help fix ventilation problems within the Family House.

**State Retiree Attraction Community** **\$ 10,000**

Promote Morgantown area as a destination for retirees and native West Virginians to relocate because of a great quality of life. The City of Morgantown is the conduit for this non-profit agency to receive this special grant funding.

**2001 Grants Received** **\$ 521,520**

**2001 TEA-21 Grant for Monongalia Blvd.** **\$ 252,000**

This grant will provide the construction of a pedestrian sidewalk and bike lane along Mon. Blvd. Between 8<sup>th</sup> Street and Star City Limits. Engineering firm has been selected and construction can begin in summer of 2003.

**2001 TEA-21 Grant for Clay Street**

**\$ 264,760**

Grant is the second phase of the Wharf District landscaping project. It will include additional site improvements in the District such as street treatment and repair, sidewalk repair, lighting, landscaping, signage, and site furniture where possible on Clay Street between Hurley and Mechanic Street.

**2002 Grant Applications still pending**

**\$ 1,470,000**

**2002 TEA-21 Grant for Clay Street #2**

**\$ 800,000**

Grant is the third phase of the Wharf District landscaping project. It will include additional site improvements in the District such as, street treatment and repair, sidewalk repair, lighting, landscaping, signage, and site furniture where possible on Clay Street between Mechanic Street and Donnely Street, & between Wharf Street and Hurley Street. Final cost estimates are currently being developed. SPECIAL NOTE: This grant was awarded December 10, 2002, in the amount of \$ 265,000.

**2002 TEA-21 Recreational Trail for Krepps Park**

**\$ 70,000**

Grant will include 3,000 feet of new, crushed-limestone, trail and a foot bridge.

**2002 TEA-21 Recreational Trail for White Park**

**\$ 40,000**

Grant will include 4,000 feet of new, crushed-limestone, trail Connecting Hite Street and Mississippi Street.

**2003 TEA-21 Recreational Trail for Marilla Park**

**\$ 60,000**

Grant will include 4,000 feet of new, crushed-limestone, trail Connecting Hite Street and Mississippi Street.

**2002 Small Cities Block Grant**

**\$ 500,000**

Grant will include three components: Owner occupied rehabilitation revolving loan program, rental rehabilitation revolving loans for landlords of low-to-moderate income households, and a down payment assistance program.
