

## STATE AND FEDERAL ASSISTANCE

The City of Morgantown has administered \$23,909,020 in twenty-five State and Federal Grants through 2005. Another \$101,000 in nine grants have recently been received and will begin to be administered in 2006. Two additional applications for \$600,000 will be decided in 2006.

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### **2001 Federal TEA-21 Grant for Patteson Drive.**

**\$252,000**

This grant will provide the construction of a pedestrian sidewalk along Patteson Drive between Laurel Street and Monongalia Blvd.. Engineering firm has been approved and final design is waiting on WVDOT approval. Bids can be advertised once the City receives a notice to proceed on construction from the WVDOT. These funds have been moved from the original sidewalk and bike lane along Monongalia Blvd.

### **2002 Federal TEA-21 Grant for Clay Street**

**\$529,520**

Project is complete in the Wharf District. It included bricking intersections, new sidewalks, new street lights, landscaping, and site furniture where possible on Clay Street between Wharf Street and Donnelly Street.

### **2003 Federal TEA-21 Upper High Street BID**

**\$400,000**

Project is in the design phase, and construction will be in spring and summer of 2006. It will place utilities running along High Street underground, replace sidewalks and lighting, and provide pedestrian amenities on High Street from Willey to Fayette Street.

Through the State's first Business Improvement District, property owners in this block will share in the improvements by contributing \$30,000 of the \$100,000 match. Due to higher than expected bids, the project will be bid again in 2006, in concert with the second portion of High Street.

**2004 Federal TEA-21 Central High Street BID**

**\$400,000**

Construction should be in spring and summer of 2006. It will place utilities running along High Street underground, replace sidewalks and lighting, and provide pedestrian amenities on High Street from Fayette to Walnut Street.

Through the State’s second Business Improvement District, property owners in this block will contribute \$30,000 toward the \$100,000 match.

The City just received the notice to proceed on engineering on this grant. Along with the Upper High Street grant, it will be bid for construction at the same time.

**Square at Falling Run Economic Development Grant**

**\$5,000,000**

Economic Development Grant to purchase land and demolish sub-standard housing for the construction of parking garage and plaza of Square at Falling Run development. WVU and a portion of McCoy 6 property has been purchased. Dilapidated housing on McCoy 6 property has been removed. Final purchase will take place when first TIF financing is in place.

**Wharf District Theatre / Marina Economic Development Grant**

**\$13,900,000**

Economic Development Grant to build a Public Theater, Marina (public docks), develop infrastructure, and improve land along Monongahela River. Hired project manager and engineering team to develop the designs needed for the project. Marina construction is anticipated in spring of 2006, with Theater construction expected in late 2006 or early 2007.

**National Biometric Security Project Economic Development Grant**

**\$2,300,000**

Economic Development Grant to develop the National Biometrics Security Project Labs in Morgantown. Startup costs and lab improvements have taken place.

**Federal Boating Infrastructure Grant (B.I.G.)**

**\$50,000**

Grant will enable the City of Morgantown to construct a floating dock just south of Walnut Street for the use of larger boats (over 27 feet long) to dock for a short period and access Morgantown.

**U.S. Parks Land and Water Conservation Fund** **\$250,000**  
Grant will enable City to purchase portion of Dorsey's Knob Park that contains the Lodge and Sky Rock.

**Metropolitan Theater Culture and History Capital Resources Grant** **\$100,000**  
Grant applied for by the Metropolitan Theater Foundation to install air-conditioning unit.

**Dorsey's Knob Park LEDA Acquisition Grant 04** **\$10,000**  
To reduce the debt by purchasing the park property, Will be a match for the Land and Water Grant.

**West Virginia Raptor Rehabilitation Center LEDA Grant 04** **\$20,000**  
Grant was used to pay a portion of the site plan and floor plans for a new facility.

**WV Botanic Garden LEDA Grant 04** **\$2,500**  
Grant will help costs associated with improving the access road within the WV Botanic Garden location.

**2005 Federal HUD Community Development Block Grant** **\$629,000**

**Main Street Morgantown GCPG Grant 05** **\$10,000**  
Grant to help with costs associated with promoting downtown Morgantown

**West Virginia Senior Legal Aid LEDA Grant 05** **\$5,000**  
Grant will be used to purchase computers and office equipment.

**Rosenbaum Family House LEDA Grant 05** **\$5,000**  
After servicing nearly 5,000 families, grant will help replace worn carpeting in guest areas.

**Metropolitan Theater Preservation Foundation LEDA Grant 05** **\$5,000**  
Grant is for promoting and advertising the Theater equipment and services.

**Community Kitchen LEDA Grant 05** **\$10,000**  
Grant will enable the Community Kitchen to purchase equipment and made improvements to the soup kitchen area.

**BOPARC Senior Center LEDA Grant 06** **\$10,000**  
Grant will enable the Senior Center to make modifications to the new home of the senior center (Former Wiles Hill School) for the use of seniors.

**West Virginia Raptor Rehabilitation Center LEDA Grant 05** **\$ 5,000**  
Grant will enable WVRRC to construct a mobile presentation bird cage for doing educational programs at the new facility and at other sites.

**2005 Federal TEA-21 Transportation Grant for  
Mid Central High Street BID (block #3)**

**\$500,000**

Grant will provide for the continuation of the High Street Streetscape improvements from Walnut Street to Pleasant Street. Improvements would include new sidewalks, lighting, and the removal of utility lines running along High Street. Property owners have petitioned to develop the States third Business Improvement District. If the Ordinances are approved, the property owners will contribute \$30,000 toward the \$120,000 match.

**U.S. Parks Land and Water Conservation Fund 2005**

**\$100,000**

Grant would enable City to improve Dorsey’s Knob Park by adding trails, public restroom facility, large picnic shelter, and equipment storage facility.
